# FY2022 Highlights

## July 2021



CMC offered Campamento CMC, a free summer arts camp for San Francisco youth in collaboration with SFUSD.



The Shenson Faculty Concert Series was launched as a summer presentation, featuring concerts with Josepha Fath, Elektra Schmidt, Diane Grubbe, Erick Peralta, and Charlie Gurke.

## August 2021



In-person lessons and classes returned to CMC on a scale not seen since the pandemic, with online learning options still available.

## September 2021



The CMC Centennial Celebrations began with two Flower Piano concerts in partnership with the SF Botanical Garden: *Latin Jazz Kick-Off* with Eduardo Corzo & Friends and *Journey through the Americas and the Great American Songbook* with Marco Diaz.

## Breaking Ground on a New Century

On February 16, 2022, CMC held a festive groundbreaking event for the campus expansion project. The short ceremony featured students and faculty from the Children's Chorus, Mission District Young Musicians Program, Mission District Older Adult Choirs, and members of the SFUSD Mariachi Program, as well as a surprise appearance by The Curtis Family C-notes singing "Lift Every Voice and Sing."

## CMC Campus Expansion Project

CMC Campus Expansion Project will increase the Mission District Branch location by 4,800 square feet and double the number of students served per year at the Mission branch. This expansion will enhance the current tuition-free programs and enable CMC to launch new programs that address critical community needs.

Supporting community gatherings, performances, and large classes with a multi-purpose space.

A soundproof room to support drum and percussion instruction, with capabilities for digital audio recording.

Beautifying the courtyard and outdoor spaces, giving more room for the community to enjoy music outdoors.

## 100 new works for 100 years

CMC featured Young Musicians Program (YMP) voices and creative work during the Centennial, giving them a central role in *(Re)Imagine: 100 New Works from Cava Menzies and Community Music Center* with musician and educator Cava Menzies. Supported by a grant from the Creative Work Fund, YMP students participated in an eight-week composition residency, coached by Cava and YMP faculty. YMP students developed 50 new pieces exploring cultural identity, critical community issues, and world music and culture with an emphasis on student-centered learning, inquiry, and self-expression. Eight additional works were collaborations between Menzies and the students. One hundred pieces premiered in 50 daily YouTube videos, each containing one piece by Cava and an artist partner, and one created by YMP students.

## The Black Music Studies Program launched

CMC's Centennial included the launch of a new tuition-free initiative: the Black Music Studies Program, developed and directed by Maestro Curtis and coordinated by Nola Curtis. The program follows the emergence of American music from the African Diaspora through talks, workshops and music practices. Five students who completed the coursework received certificates of completion. In its first year, the Black Music Studies Program had robust enrollment with students in their 20s through their 80s, learning about the history of Black music before and during the Atlantic Slave Trade, Black music origins of small ensemble singing, the history of Black choral singing, and historical foundations of West African drumming and tribal singing.

## Centennial commission celebrated Black music history

CMC was proud to present the world premiere of *A Song of Triumph: The History of Black Music* by Maestro Curtis at the Yerba Buena Gardens Festival (YBGF). The commission and premiere were an extension of CMC's Black Music Studies Program and produced in partnership with YBGF. The premiere, commissioned by CMC with support from the Sahm Family Foundation, featured performances by Maestro Curtis, The Curtis Family C-notes and special guests, including Dorothy Morrison, Bishop James Adams, Juan Escovedo, Pastor Harold Gordon, Kam Krzy, Ken Little, Larry Douglas, Ricardo Scales, Tony Bolivar, J.R. Hall, Tina Bryant, and Neil Stallings. More than 200 concertgoers experienced storytelling through music about Black history. *A Song of Triumph* was a musical celebration, encapsulating both the suffering and the beauty of the Black experience.

## Older adults received technology support in hybrid learning model

After 18 months of learning completely online, most of the Older Adult Choirs returned to choir classes in an in-person/remote format in the fall of 2021. An important part of these hybrid classes' success was narrowing the digital divide for choir members who needed to attend remotely, but did not have the technology or know-how to participate. To address this digital divide in the Older Adult Choir Program, the Community Living Campaign, an organization dedicated to enhancing technology access for seniors in San Francisco, provided CMC a grant for 15 iPads to distribute to choir members from Western Addition, Bayanihan Equity, Castro, and Centro Latino choirs. Choir members volunteered to teach their fellow singers to use the iPads and Zoom.



## CMC continued as a leader in the field of creative aging

CMC's Older Adult Choir Program was featured in a report commissioned by the Coalition of Agencies Serving the Elderly (CASE) and the San Francisco Department of Disability and Aging Services (DAS), spotlighting eight San Francisco nonprofits who successfully pivoted during the pandemic.

Additionally, Mission District choirs from the Older Adult Choir Program, directed by Martha Rodríguez-

Salazar, were featured in a National Guild online conference session. Rodríguez-Salazar demonstrated how to run a choir session and addressed physical, cognitive, and psycho-social engagement. CMC's Coro Solera, in partnership with Mission Neighborhood Center, performed at an awards ceremony organized by the METTA Fund, for honoring Shireen McSpadden, former Director of DAS.

## An intergenerational performance wished CMC "Happy Birthday"

The Mission District Young Musicians Program (MDYMP) presented an intergenerational performance on the theme of *History Matters in the Mission*, to kick-start CMC's Centennial in partnership with Acción Latina's community art stroll Paseo Artístico. The MDYMP performance featured a collaboration between students, faculty, and alumni, highlighting the tradition of passing music through generations of CMC students. The finale of the event was a rousing rendition of "Las Mañanitas" ("Happy Birthday") for CMC's centenary. The ensemble was composed of young musicians and faculty from MDYMP, Mission District Older Adult Choir members, and two CMC faculty members who are also MDYMP alumni: Nena Aldaz and Cecilia Peña Govea (aka La Doña).

## CMC and SFUSD united to celebrate rich culture and community of the Mission District

MDYMP and the SFUSD Mariachi Program banded together in a spirited contingent for the Carnaval SF Grand Parade. The theme of their comparsa was *Música Para Todos-Music for Everyone: Community Music Center and SFUSD Mariachi Partners Celebrate 100 years of Music for Everyone*. Participating musicians included MDYMP and SFUSD students and teachers from the Mariachi program at Dolores Huerta Elementary and Thurgood Marshall Academic High School. MDYMP also performed in the Carnaval SF Festival. Along with their traditional Latin music repertoire, they performed original student compositions from *(Re)Imagine: 100 New Works from Cava Menzies & Community Music Center*.

## Faculty-led workshops honored and innovated musical traditions

Two highly successful online faculty projects from 2020 were CMC Sessions, from the Cultural Traditions Department, and Spotlight Seminars, from the Piano Department. These departments joined together in 2021–2022 in a collaboration funded by a CMC Faculty Partnership Grant.

CMC Sessions: Traditions Moving Forward showcased the talents of ten faculty members from diverse classical and non-classical traditions. Online presenters used video, audio, and lecture-demonstrations to illustrate the influences and musical education that shaped them, and highlighted how their unique interests impact their teaching and performing at CMC. Their personal stories illustrated the breadth of talent among CMC's teachers and showed some of the ways CMC is creatively adapting historical traditions to inspire and guide the musicians of tomorrow. Subject matter in these workshops included the Black history of the National Anthem, supporting neurodiverse music students, combining Western classical training and composition with World and Latin music traditions, improvisation as a teaching tool, and community engagement in the careers of faculty.

## Jon Jang presented world premiere examining U.S. immigration policies

Piano faculty member Jon Jang collaborated with Paul S. Flores, PEN award-winning novelist, Paseo Artístico (CMC partner) Coordinator and poet, on the world premiere of *American in CAGES Only*. The new piece was an outcry against U.S. immigration policies on the southern border, where families have been separated and many children remain in custody. It was also a searing examination of the U.S.'s internment of Japanese-American families during WWII. This world premiere was performed by the Jon Jangtet and Paul S. Flores, and presented by Asian Pacific Islander Cultural Center with community partners Asian Improv Nation and Community Music Center.

### An upsurge in donor support

During our Centennial, the CMC community came together to provide a level of support unlike anything we've seen before. Over the course of the year, there was a 20% increase in the number of endowed scholarships. Thanks to the generosity of three donors, five new merit scholarships were endowed with an initial investment of \$50,000 each. These new scholarships will provide fully paid tuition for students exhibiting excellence and financial need. Many Centennial Sponsors and donors at all levels helped to strengthen our bedrock, as we head into our second century. This robust support will help us grow our tuition-assistance programs, keeping pace with student population growth with CMC's Campus Expansion Project.

### Note on Tax Credit Compliance

In FY21, CMC was awarded New Market Tax Credits (NMTC) to help support operations and construction of our new facility at 552 Capp Street. Though the credits are a net benefit to CMC, you will see our balance sheet shows a large loan being donated to an affiliate nonprofit organization, CMC Leverage Lender Inc., which operates exclusively for the benefit of CMC. This is a standard requirement for the NMTC program. After the seven-year NMTC compliance period is successfully completed, the loans will be forgiven and a \$1.5 million dollar net benefit realized on our balance sheet.
